

ELECTIONS 2019: HIGHEST TURNOUT IN 20 YEARS




The results of the 2019 European elections held on Sunday May 26 in Spain and much of Europe are already beginning to be revealed. Participation in Europe has been close to 51%, which represents a significant increase and the highest rate for the last twenty years. This figure counteracts the fall in participation in Portugal (around 30%), being the lowest in its democratic history.

As for the results, the first projections of the European Parliament indicate that the European People's Party has won the European elections with 179 seats, the Socialists would have obtained 147, something below the polls. In third place, ALDE-Reinassance, the formation product of the merger of the Liberals with the movement of Emmanuel Macron, which bursts with 102 seats according to this exercise. And finally, 69 seats for Greens/EFA.


Currently, the political groups in the European Parliament are: European People's Party (EPP), Progressive Alliance of Socialists and Democrats (S & D), European Conservatives and Reformists (ECR), Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe (ALDE), Left Unitary European / Nordic Green Left (GUE / NGL), The Greens / European Free Alliance (Greens-EFA) and Europe of Freedom and Direct Democracy (EFDD).

The rise of conservative and far right parties in countries such as France, Italy, Poland or Belgium stands out, while the Greens experience a sustained rise throughout the EU (Germany, France ...) reflected in the new projection of the European Parliament.

FACTS AND FIGURES: EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT'S 2014-2019 TERM



What was the European Parliament like during its 2014-2019 term? Find out some interesting facts ahead of the European elections on 23-26 May that will shape the next Parliament.

Less than half of the MEPs that arrived in July 2014 were new to the Parliament. Some 51.5% had served as MEPs previously. Greece had the largest proportion of new MEPs at 90.5%.

The share of women MEPs was 36.9% at the start of the term, decreasing slightly to 36.5% at end of March 2019.

The average age of MEPs at the end of March 2019 was 55. At the constituent session in July 2014 the average was 53. Between July 2014 and March 2019, 108 MEPs left: 43 resigned, six died and 59 started a new job.


Plenary sessions are the pinnacle of MEPs' work, when they vote on legislation and debate topical issues. During the 2009-2014 term there were 260 days of plenary amounting to 2,160 hours. From July 2014 to December 2018, MEPs had already attended 255 days of plenary totalling 2,187 hours of sittings. They held more than 27,000 votes by the end of 2018, up from 23,553 in the previous term.

Legislation is proposed by the European Commission and has to be approved by the European Parliament and the Council of the EU before becoming law. MEPs negotiate with EU governments to reach an agreement on the final text of the legislation. Depending on how hard the negotiations are, there could be up to three readings in both Parliament and Council.

MEPS CALL FOR EU MAGNITSKY ACT TO IMPOSE SANCTIONS ON HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSERS



MEPs backed a resolution calling for new EU human rights sanctions to punish state and non-state actors responsible for gross violations of human rights.

In a resolution adopted, the European Parliament calls for a new sanctions regime to be established at EU level to impose asset freezes and visa bans on individuals involved in grave human rights violations. The list should include state and non-state actors who have contributed, physically, financially or through acts of systemic corruption, to such abuse and crimes, worldwide.

The new sanctions regime would strengthen the EU's role as a global human rights actor and should symbolically carry the name of Sergei Magnitsky, MEPs say.

Mr Magnitsky was a Russian tax accountant investigating corruption who died in a Moscow prison in 2009, having endured inhumane conditions and torture. Similar legislative frameworks are already in place in the United States, Canada, and several EU countries, namely in Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania and the United Kingdom.

MEPs finally welcome the proposal made by the President of the Commission to move beyond unanimity voting, in Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) areas in Council decision-making. In this context, they urge EU member states to adopt this new sanctions instrument so that a qualified majority in the Council may adopt human rights sanctions.

The resolution was adopted by 447 to 70, with 46 abstentions.

NGOS SAVING LIVES IN THE MEDITERRANEAN: MEPS TO ASSESS THE SITUATION



Each year, the European Parliament awards the Sakharov Prize to Freedom of Thought, named in honor of the physicist and Soviet political dissident Andrei Sakharov. It was created in 1988 to honor individuals and organizations that defend human rights and fundamental freedoms. 2018 marks 30 years since the Sakharov Prize was first awarded.

The finalist NGOs of the Sakharov Prize 2018, who carried out rescue operations in the Mediterranean and are now prevented from operating, have spoken about their work with the MEPs. Members of the Civil Liberties Committee and the Subcommittee on Human Rights debated the legal framework for search and rescue operations, as well as the challenges faced by people working in the field with representatives of NGOs.

Speakers included EP Vice President Heidi Hautala (Greens / EFA, FI), members of Sea Watch, Solidarity at Sea, Sea Eye, Seebrücke Germany, Open Arms, Doctors Without Borders and Maritime Assistance Station for Migrants, as well as a migrant rescued in Mar and several academics working in the field of migration.


THE COMMISSION REPORTS ON ITS ACTIONS TO PROMOTE THE EQUALITY OF LGBTI PEOPLE



The European Commission publishes the annual report on its action plan to advance the equality of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex (LGBTI), which was launched in 2015.

The first vice president, Frans Timmermans, said: "All people should be treated equally, regardless of where they come from, their creed, their sex, their age or their sexual identity or orientation. Therefore, it is absolutely natural for LGBTI people to enjoy the same opportunities and rights as any other person. This is what Europe is about. This is what we are".

In 2018, the Commission supported NGOs from 25 Member States to promote the equality of LGBTI people, intensified the fight against hate speech through the Code of Conduct to combat the crime of incitement to hate online with leading technology companies of information, produced a series of video testimonies to raise awareness about the acceptance of LGBTI people and participated in the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia (IDAHOT) and in the Gay Pride celebrations around the world.


SURVEY ON FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS EUROPEAN SOCIAL FUND



The European Parliament is backing updated rules to tackle unemployment and high rates of poverty in the EU. The report, adopted in plenary on 4 April, proposes to increase funding for the European Social Fund in the EU's budget for 2021-2027 with a primary focus on youth employment and children.

Many people are concerned about social and employment issues. Parliament wants the EU to do more on social issues by supporting a renewed and simplified European Social Fund, known as the European Social Fund Plus' (ESF+).

The new version of the fund could then help to create full employment, boost the quality of work, increase productivity, make it easier for people to find work in a different part of the EU, improve education and training as well as promote social inclusion and health.

Parliament will now have to negotiate the regulation with the Council during the next parliamentary term.

EU, LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN: PARTNERING FOR PROSPERITY, DEMOCRACY, RESILIENCE AND GLOBAL GOVERNANCE



The European Union is strengthening its political partnership with Latin America and the Caribbean by focusing it on four priorities – prosperity, democracy, resilience and effective global governance – for common future.

The vision for a stronger and modernised bi-regional partnership focused on trade, investment and sectoral cooperation is set out in a new joint communication presented by the European Commission and the High Representative. This new partnership aims at working together in changing global and regional realities that require joint efforts to address common challenges and opportunities.

Building on the achievements of the last decades, the partnership should concentrate on four mutually reinforcing priorities, underpinned by concrete initiatives and targeted EU engagement with the region:

Partnering for Prosperity – by supporting sustainable growth and decent jobs; reducing socio-economic inequalities; transitioning towards a digital, green and circular economy; as well as further strengthening and deepening the already solid trade and investment relationship

Partnering for Democracy – by strengthening the international human rights regime including gender equality; empowering civil society; consolidating the rule of law; and ensuring credible elections and effective public institutions

Partnering for Resilience – by improving climate resilience, environment and biodiversity; fighting against inequalities through fair taxation and social protection; fighting organised crime; and deepening dialogue and cooperation on migration and mobility, in particular to prevent irregular migration, trafficking in human beings

Partnering for effective global governance – by strengthening the multilateral system, including for climate and environmental governance; deepening cooperation on peace and security; and implementing the 2030 Agenda.

VIOLACIONES DE LOS DERECHOS HUMANOS EN BRUNEI, CHINA Y CAMERÚN



MEPs deplore human rights violations and all forms of political repression in Brunei, China and Cameroon.

The European Parliament has adopted three resolutions taking stock of human rights situation in Brunei, China and Cameroon.

MEPs strongly condemn the entry into force of the Sharia Penal Code in Brunei that introduces the death penalty by stoning for consensual same-sex acts, extramarital sex and abortion, as well as amputation for stealing, for both adults and children. They express concern that while many countries are decriminalising consensual same sex acts, Brunei has become the seventh country to punish them.

Parliament is concerned about the increasingly repressive regime that many religious and ethnic minorities, such as Uyghurs, Kazakhs, Tibetans and Christians, are facing in China. The situation is rapidly deteriorating, placing additional restraints on their fundamental rights. It calls on the Chinese Government to put an end to arbitrary detentions, without any charge, trial or conviction for criminal offence, of members of the Uyghur and Kazakh minority and Tibetans.

Parliament also urges the government in Cameroon to initiate a consensual review of the country's electoral system, with the aim of ensuring a free, transparent and credible electoral process.


10 YEARS OF THE EASTERN PARTNERSHIP: CELEBRATIONS IN BRUSSELS



On Monday 13 and Tuesday 14 May, to mark the 10th Anniversary of the Eastern Partnership (#EaP10), the President of the European Commission, Jean-Claude Juncker, the President of the European Council, Donald Tusk, and High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy/Vice-President of the European Commission, Federica Mogherini, are hosting a series of high-level gatherings in Brussels with the participation of the six Eastern partner countries, EU Member States and other stakeholders.

High Representative /Vice-President, Federica Mogherini, will chair the annual Eastern Partnership Foreign Affairs Ministerial Meeting on 13 May with the 28 EU Member States, the EU's six Eastern partners and the Commissioner for European Neighbourhood Policy and Enlargement Negotiations, Johannes Hahn. The meeting will take stock of the progress made under the ambitious 20 Deliverables for 2020 work plan adopted at the last Eastern Partnership Summit of November 2017.

Two types of internships are available: CoR Traineeship or Short-term study visits.



AIMS

To provide a first-hand experience of the workings of the CoR and of the EU institutions in general;

to provide practical knowledge of the working of its departments;

to work in a multicultural and multilingual environment;

to enable trainees to have the opportunity to organise a study visit to a European local or regional authority, in connection with the Committee's political priorities;

to enable trainees to develop and put into practice the knowledge they have acquired during their studies or personal careers.

Trainees are selected from nationals of the EU Member States. However a limited number of nationals of non-member countries may be accepted.



(number of cases per 100 people)




